At HIPPY, we believe that parents play a vital role in creating a promising future for their families and communities. With HIPPY Halton's early literacy program and the strong support of the Home Visitors, parents can overcome challenges and ensure a bright future for their children.

Research indicates that children whose parents are actively involved in their education tend to achieve higher academic success, develop better social skills, and enjoy improved overall well-being.

We are proud to report that 91% of parents and children completed the program.

This is a 4% increase from last year!

135 parents and 163 children worked with HIPPY Halton this year. Our home visitors connected with 38% of families in person and 62% through a hybrid model. Thank you to our Home Visitors and our Outreach Worker for your dedication and enthusiasm. You are the key to our success!

BOTH THE SMART AND HIPPY 30-week programs develop early literacy skills:

- Home Visitors spend an hour each week teaching parents the structured early literacy curriculum activities and strategies based on toys and books.
- Families keep the books and toys, which help them build their own tools and resources.
- Parents teach their children the activities for 5 days.
- Home visitors check parents' and children's work during each visit. They note and record progress in a
 national database, mentor and encourage parents, and assist with any challenges they face.

Outcomes:

- Empowered parents see themselves as their children's first and best teachers.
- Parents learn how to create a supportive learning environment.
- Children enter school with confidence and skills, ready to learn.
- Parents are less isolated and are involved in school and community life.
- Home Visitors develop skills, gain work experience, and build a resume.
- Home Visitors are able to move on to higher-level positions, thus creating opportunities for other mothers to become Home Visitors.
- Mothers are given the opportunity to work in their first job in Canada.

QUICK FACTS:

HIPPY Halton Families:

- Come from 27 countries and speak more than 24 languages in addition to English.
- Although HIPPY is not an ESL program, mothers' English skills improve and develop as they work through the program.
- 91% of the families successfully completed the HIPPY or SMART program this year.
- 86% of the parents feel confident communicating with teachers or staff at their child's school.
- 91% of the HIPPY parents report that they feel a sense of belonging in their community.








Program delivery highlights:

- Over the 30 weeks of the HIPPY and SMART programs, parents received 4066 hours of instruction and mentorship while working with Home Visitors.
- Mothers spent at least one and three-quarter hours each week teaching their children the literacy activities.
- A total of 16 Parents' Group Meetings were held in Milton and Oakville.
- Home Visitors provided additional information, referrals, actions, and support to families 1188 times over the year.
- Home Visitors received 1367 hours of training.


We are delighted to share that we signed a lease on our own new space in June.
